RELOCATION TO THE NEW STATE COURTS TOWERS

The State Courts will be relocating to the State Courts Towers and will commence operations thereat in two phases on 9 December 2019 and 16 December 2019 respectively, as follows:

COURTROOMS AND OTHER FACILITIES

2. The new State Courts Towers are fitted with 53 courtrooms and 54 hearing chambers to meet the increasing caseload and growing needs of the community. Besides the courtrooms and hearing chambers, there are also a heritage gallery, a cafeteria and a library that are open to members of the public.

ACCESS TO THE STATE COURTS TOWERS

4. The State Courts Towers are adjacent to the current State Courts Building. Its main entrance faces Havelock Road and the vehicle drop-off point is situated at Havelock Square, with pedestrian and wheelchair access from Upper Cross Street or from Havelock Square. The nearest MRT station is Chinatown Station (via Exit D). Please refer to **Annex A** for the location map.

CAR PARK

5. The car park in the State Courts Towers is not open to the public. Lawyers and members of the public may park their vehicles at the public car parks in the vicinity.

SECURITY CHECKS

6. All lawyers and members of the public must pass through security screening at the main entrance before entering the State Court Towers.

LOCATION OF COURTROOMS AND CHAMBERS

7. Both the Mentions Courts (4A and 4B) located on Level 4 may accommodate about 80 persons each and have an upper gallery for members of the public. The courtrooms are equipped with projection screens to project real-time transcription of cases as well as any photograph or video recording tendered as evidence.

8. The Regulatory Offences Day Court (7A) and the Traffic Court (7B) are located on Level 7, while the Night Courts (4A-N and 4B-N) are located on Level 4.

9. The Community Courts (18A and 18B) and the Coroner's Court (18C) are located on Level 18. Selected courtrooms are equipped with witness rooms adjacent to them and video-conferencing facilities for vulnerable witnesses.

10. The courtrooms for civil trials are located on Levels 26 and 27. Most of the hearings before the Deputy Registrars will be conducted in the hearing chambers located on Levels 2, 3, 4 and 5. The Pre-Trial Conference Centre is located on Level 8.

11. Please refer to Annex B for the location of the various courtrooms and hearing chambers.

CENTRAL REGISTRY AND BUSINESS CENTRE

12. The Central Registry and Business Centre are located on Level 2. The Central Registry serves as a "one-stop service centre" for general enquiries and common registry functions such as the filing of fresh appeals and applications for court records. Please refer to **Annex C** for the services provided at the Central Registry.

- 13. The Central Registry also integrates the following services under its ambit:
 - (a) Appointments with Bailiffs;
 - (b) Further Inquiry sessions for Magistrate's Complaints; and
 - (c) Access to certain hearing chambers for civil cases.

14. Court users who wish to prepare their documents, file claims or make online applications for their cases will be able to do so at the Business Centre. The Business Centre is equipped with facilities such as computers with internet access, printers and scanners.

ONLINE FILING AND CASE MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

15. The State Courts' case management systems, namely the Integrated Case Management System (ICMS), eLitigation (e-Lit) and the Community Justice and Tribunals System (CJTS), will not be affected during the move to the State Courts Towers. Lawyers and court users can continue to access these case management systems for their cases.


Drop off Point and Pedestrian Access





