FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What is a Renunciation? A Renunciation is a document signed by a beneficiary with prior right confirming that he or she is renouncing (i.e. giving up) his or her right to apply for letters of administration.

2. Who must the renunciation be signed before?

The beneficiary who is renouncing his or her right to apply for letters of administration has to sign the renunciation before an advocate and solicitor or a Commissioner for Oaths.
