

ADVISORY ON DOCUMENTS PURPORTING TO BE COURT ORDERS

Members of the public are alerted to the emergence of emails containing or referring to a document that purports to be an Order of the Singapore International Commercial Court (“SICC”), and purports to direct the defendant in a case to (among other things) obtain digital contract signatures from persons who are not parties to the case. The document concerned is not an Order issued by the SICC.

2 Members of the public who wish to verify the authenticity of an Order issued by the SICC may do so through the “Authentic Court Orders” court service (<https://www.courtorders.gov.sg>) provided by the Singapore Courts, by keying in the corresponding verification details found in the Order.
